The so-called "residence marriage" enables a spouse to receive legal permission to live in their new country.

Seifeddine Souilah, 20 got to know an Italian girl through Facebook. <u>She</u> is 22 years old. They hosted her at their house, and she met the family. The two lovers got along well and decided to get married after completing the necessary documents for his residence in Italy. They are so satisfied about their marriage. Given his discouraging academic results and unemployment rate in Tunisia, Souilah decided to look for a better future outside Tunisia. He added that he didn't find an easier way than looking for a European wife.

Iskandar Souilam is a young man who married a German. Although his financial situation has improved since he moved, he regrets immigrating_ and marrying a foreigner in order to obtain legal residence in Germany. He believes that marrying a woman from a different culture than Arab and Muslim is a major obstacle to family stability.

European countries have become more aware of the reality of these types of relations. Immigration authorities now reject such marriage requests and establish numerous conditions to prevent immigrants from using it as a way to establish residency. The new laws require that the spouses spend a long period of time together before <u>they</u> are granted legal residency. In addition, immigration bureaus send social workers to visit the matrimonial house at any time, especially at night, to make sure that the spouses are actually living under one roof.

Helene Hammouda, Press Attaché at the French Embassy in Tunis, explained that French laws make provision for criminal sanctions in case of marriage of convenience or false marriages. She added that French law imposes a five-year prison sentence and 15,000-euro fine upon anyone participating in <u>such</u> <u>unions</u>.

Western Valentine's Day has become a hugely popular festival in China over the past few years since the Middle Kingdom has opened to the West. Despite the fact that China already has its own lover's day, Qixi Festival, many Chinese, especially young couples, college students and urban socialites, get into Western Valentine's Day and enjoy celebrating <u>this romantic holiday</u>.

Since Valentine's Day is a Western import, many of the ways in which Chinese celebrate it are also influenced by Western customs. For instance, some of the most common traditions are for lovers to exchange greeting cards and chocolates, or to go see a film together. February 14 is considered a romantic day in many of China's cities, and you will often observe couples strolling together hand-in-hand on that day.

The influence of Western customs on China's Valentine's Day celebrations leads some people to dine in Western restaurants and coffee shops on February 14. In cities like Shanghai and Beijing, many restaurants offer Valentine's Day specials, romantic meals, special wines and other deals to entice amorous couples to dine out.

Though traditionally a couple's day, many young Chinese singles celebrate this festival by getting together in **groups** and eating dinner or enjoying a film together. Friends and relatives also show that Valentine's Day is not solely a lovers' holiday by sending greeting cards, candies and other tokens to show their care and love in a non-romantic way.

Shops and department stores also get into the Valentine's Day spirit with decorations and sales. For cultural reasons, and in light of the difficulty of reaching schools, some families prefer to invest in educating boys rather than girls. Jamal Hdidouche, a teacher in rural communities for ten years, told Magharebia that despite the development being witnessed in Morocco, attitudes have not changed. "Most parents feel their daughters should marry early and so deprive <u>them</u> of schooling despite the efforts of teachers. Some [girls] leave in the middle of the school year."

This is the situation of Touria Farahi, 16, who is in the third year of secondary school. Her parents obtained a judge's permission to marry her off, because the legal age under the Family Code is 18. Touria had hoped to finish her secondary studies. Her mother, Kenza, is uncompromising. Working her way through a tub of dirty laundry, <u>she</u> told Magharebia the destiny of all girls from good families lies in marriage. "I never wanted my daughter to be a teacher or a doctor". Kenza knows that they don't have the means to reach these objectives, so she must marry as soon as possible.

The girl, eyes brimming with tears, scrubs the floor in the hallway of the family home before exclaiming in desperation: "At least let <u>me</u> get my baccalaureate. I won't wear myself out travelling the 10 kilometres between us and the school." But Kenza's mind is made up. "Even if she doesn't marry this year, I won't let her be exposed to the dangers on the road to go and study," she said.

Civic groups, meanwhile, are playing a leading role in promoting education for country girls. Ahmed Charouf of the Olive Branches association says group members are travelling to rural areas of Morocco to encourage parents to let their daughters go to school. Sometimes, they manage to convince a few people.



But usually they come up against inflexible attitudes. "We have been able to persuade several family heads to send their daughters to school, but others would hear nothing of it." He added, however, that in recent years his group has "seen some progress in the level of school attendance among girls.

To deal with the problem of distance, some associations are issuing bicycles to students so that they can get to school without too much difficulty. The state is also taking action. The Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity is building and equipping centres to accommodate and care for young girls from poor families who are attending school. <u>This action</u> is being led in collaboration with local communities, the National Order of Architects, the Public Testing and Study Laboratory and NGOs.

For residents of the southern Moroccan commune of Tata, the recent municipal elections proved to be truly groundbreaking. Fatima Boujenah, a 21-year-old baccalaureate holder, became the youngest leader of a local council in the entire kingdom. The fact that this young woman was elected in a rural area has come as a surprise to many.

Sociologist Jamila Mourabiti said the news

shows that Moroccan society is changing, especially in rural areas that tend to be conservative. "In general, it is men who get involved in politics in rural areas," <u>she</u> said. "It is rare for a woman to enter the political arena there; the example set by Boujenah is a good starting-point."

The new council leader and member of the Authenticity and Modernity Party (PAM) previously showed initiative in civil society groups like *Jeunes de Tagnart* (Youth of Tagnart), where she served as president. Sources within the PAM said she has built a reputation as a courageous and ambitious young lady.

Boujenah was born into a family of modest means, with a father who works in a café in Casablanca. She always dreamed of playing an important role in changing the daily lives of the people around her.

The newly-elected official told the press that she sought involvement in local affairs out of love for the people in her community, especially the women. She also said that she decided to stand for election at the request of residents of her commune, who showed confidence in the "<u>educated country girl</u> capable of doing something for the good of the people in this mountainous area".

"Being elected leader of the local council and working alongside men was something completely out of the ordinary," she said. She didn't think she'd become the council leader. <u>That</u> happened thanks to the support of her family and the people who live in her village.

As the baccalaureate exam looms, many Tunisian students are turning to websites that offer help with their studies. But students, teachers and parents sometimes have vastly different takes on <u>this innovation</u>'s role in learning.



"I rely on online questions to assess my real abilities," one student, Tarek Wafi said. He added that students can also access the correct answers through the internet. Any method a student can use to gain knowledge is "useful and can be harnessed so as to realise success", a general supervisor at the Education Ministry, Belkassem Hassan, told Magharebia.

But veteran secondary school teacher Taoufik Ben Nasser believes that the online lessons aren't now popular in homes and cyber-cafés can't replace fleshand-blood educators. "I'm not against students looking for help to understand their lessons or solve tough problems," said Ben Nasser. "But does everything that's offered online conform to the ideal pedagogical method?" "It's not enough to post questions and offer the answers," he added. "What's more important is to present it all in an educational way that enables students to understand it."

Many students who cannot afford private tutoring, which gets expensive as the bac nears, look to online lessons. The price is right compared to tutoring in mathematics or physics, which can cost from 120 to 400 dinars a month for just two hours a week. Generally, tutoring prices are set according to the prosperity of the student's neighbourhood. The cost of private tutoring weighs heavily on many families, as one mother of a bac candidate, Madiha Yakoubi, can testify. She doesn't think online lessons will solve the problem because they tried that. As a result, **they** often caught thier son chatting with his friends. One cyber-café employee, Salem Belkhair, said that students who frequent his business are either hard workers who cannot afford private tutoring, or sneaks who convince their parents to pay for online lessons but surf for fun.

Education supervisor Ahmad Sayd also said he doubted on the seriousness of students learning online. He said that students got the test and got it done like lightning. "So they don't make the necessary effort. **They**'re always impatient to get the right answers. That's bad; we can call it dependence." "So it's not just a question of the content offered on the internet. It has to do with how serious students are," he added. "Either way, online lessons remain the answer for students who can't afford private tutoring."

In Britain, many people think of tea as being a tradition almost entirely of their own, with Afternoon Tea being the ultimate way of enjoying it. In fact, <u>this</u> is of course not entirely true! Tea has a long history, and is enjoyed throughout the world. For example, in Russia it is sipped with sugar lumps clenched between the teeth; in Tibet it is mixed with Yak butter; and in North Africa it is mixed with mint.

However, the quintessential English Afternoon Tea is considered by people throughout the world to be the most enjoyable way to have tea. The typical English tradition of Afternoon Tea is said to have been created by Anna, 7th Duchess of Bedford in the early 1800's, as she grew hungry between meals. At this time the English had two main meals a day – breakfast and evening dinner. It was no wonder that the Duchess introduced the idea of afternoon tea to stop her feeling tired and hungry in the middle of the afternoon! She instructed <u>her</u> servants to serve tea and little cakes at five o'clock in her boudoir. The experience was so delightful that Anna repeated it every afternoon thereafter, and she began to invite friends to join her.

Soon others followed the Duchess' lead, and in just a few decades the custom of "taking tea" in the afternoon had become well established. At first <u>the</u> <u>practice</u> was limited to the upper classes and became more elaborate over the years, consisting of small cakes, bread and butter sandwiches and assorted sweets, which was of course accompanied by tea. By the 1900's ladies were dressing up especially for the occasion and it was seen as a graceful event bringing people together for a brief hour of pleasure and conversation, but it eventually became so popular that tea shops and tea-rooms began opening for the enjoyment of the general public.

Afternoon Tea also caught on in fine hotels in the late 1800's. They began to offer tea served by waitresses in tearooms and tea gardens, and Afternoon Tea became the hallmark of elegance for many of the hotels.

UNICEF's child protection programmes seek to address:

Child Marriage

The practice of girls marrying at a young age is most common in sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia. However, in the Middle East, North Africa and other parts of Asia, marriage at or shortly after teenage years is common among some groups. There are also parts of West and East Africa and of South Asia where marriages much earlier than puberty are not unusual. Parents choose to marry off their daughters early for a number of reasons. Poor families may regard a young girl as an economic burden and her marriage as a necessary survival strategy for her family. **They** may think that child marriage offers protection for their daughter from the dangers of sexual assault, or more generally, offers the care of a male guardian. Child marriage may also be seen as a strategy to avoid girls becoming pregnant outside marriage.

Child Labour

An estimated 158 million children aged 5-14 are engaged in child labour - one in six children in the world. Millions of children are engaged in hazardous situations or conditions, such as working in mines, working with chemicals and pesticides in agriculture or working with dangerous machinery. **They** are everywhere but invisible, toiling as domestic servants in homes, labouring behind the walls of workshops, hidden from view in plantations. Children living in the poorest households and in rural areas are most likely to be engaged in child labour. Millions of girls who work as domestic servants are especially vulnerable to exploitation and abuse. Labour often interferes with children's education. Ensuring that all children go to school and that their education is of good quality are keys to preventing child labour.

Violence against children

Violence is found in schools, institutions (such as orphanages and other residential care), on the streets, in the workplace and in prisons. Children experience violence at home, within their family and from other children. A small proportion of violence against children leads to death, but most often the violence does not even leave visible marks. Yet it is one of the most serious problems affecting children today. Much violence is hidden. Children may not feel able to report acts of violence for fear of retribution from their abuser. Both child and abuser may see

nothing unusual or wrong in the child being subjected to violence. They may not consider an act of violence actually to be violence at all, perhaps viewing it as justifiable and necessary punishment. The child victim may feel ashamed or guilty, believing that the violence was deserved. <u>This</u> often leads the child to be unwilling to speak about it.

Chinese Chopsticks

Chopsticks play an important role in Chinese food culture. Chopsticks are called "Kuaizi" in Chinese and were called "Zhu" in ancient times. Chinese people have been using kuaizi as one of the main tableware for more than 3,000 years.

It was recorded in Liji (The Book of Rites) that chopsticks were used in the Shang Dynasty (1600 BC - 1100 BC). It was mentioned in Shiji (the Chinese history book) by Sima Qian (about 145 BC) that Zhou, the last king of the Shang Dynasty (around 1100 BC), used ivory chopsticks. Experts believe the history of wood or bamboo chopsticks can be dated to about 1,000 years earlier than ivory chopsticks. Bronze chopsticks were invented in the Western Zhou Dynasty (1100 BC - 771 BC). Lacquer chopsticks from the Western Han (206 BC - 24 AD) were discovered in Mawangdui, China. Gold and silver chopsticks became popular in the Tang Dynasty (618 - 907). It was believed that silver chopsticks could detect poisons in food.

Chopsticks can be classified into five groups based on the materials used to make them, i.e., wood, metal, bone, stone and compound chopsticks. Bamboo and wood chopsticks are the most popular <u>ones</u> used in Chinese homes.

There are a few things to avoid when using

chopsticks. Chinese people usually don't beat their bowls while eating, since the behaviour used to be practiced by beggars. Also don't insert chopsticks in a bowl upright because it is a custom exclusively used in sacrifice.

If you are really interested in chopsticks, you may want to visit the Kuaizi Museum in Shanghai. The museum collected over 1,000 pairs of chopsticks. The oldest one was from the Tang Dynasty.

How Cell Phones Affect the School Environment

When mobile cell phones were first released, they were only really used by the wealthy business men; the phones were so large that it was near impossible to carry *them* around. But then something amazing happened, pay as you go mobile phones were released, and could be purchased by any one of any age. The design of handsets got smaller and sleeker, and the technology that was being loaded into them was mind-blowing.

Most schools have already signalled the cell phone as disruptive and distractive, and have set aside policies that forbid the use of them on school grounds. No other sporting event captures the world's imagination like the FIFA World Cup[™]. Ever since the first tentative competition in Uruguay in 1930, FIFA's flagship has constantly grown in popularity and prestige.

A group of visionary French football administrators, led in the 1920s by the innovative Jules Rimet, are credited with the original idea of bringing the world's strongest national football teams together to compete for the title of World Champions. The original gold trophy bore Jules Rimet's name and was contested three times in the 1930s, before the Second World War put a 12-year stop to the competition.

When it resumed, the FIFA World Cup rapidly advanced to its undisputed status as the greatest single sporting event of the modern world. Held since 1958 alternately in Europe and the Americas, the World Cup broke new ground with the Executive Committee's decision in May 1996 to select Korea and Japan as co-hosts for the 2002 edition.

Since 1930, the 16 tournaments have seen only seven different winners. However, the FIFA World Cup has also been punctuated by dramatic upsets that have helped create football history - the United States defeating England in 1950, North Korea's defeat of Italy in 1966, Cameroon's emergence in the 1980s and their opening match defeat of the Argentinean cup-holders in 1990....

Today, the FIFA World Cup holds the entire global public under <u>its</u> spell. An accumulated audience of over 37 billion people watched the France 98 tournament, including approximately 1.3 billion for the final alone, while over 2.7 million people flocked to watch the 64 matches in the French stadium.

After all these years and so many changes, however, the main focus of the FIFA World Cup remains the same - the glistening golden trophy, <u>which</u> is the embodiment of every footballer's ambition.

Many Moroccan women dream of hiring a maid to help them with the housework. But <u>few</u> are aware of the many tensions that can arise between employers and their maids until they take a deeper look into the industry of domestic work. Even those lucky enough to find a housekeeper have difficulty keeping them in their employ.



Moroccan maid

Samira Bidaoui is one Moroccan woman who had to either find a solid housekeeper or quit her job to

tend to her home. The mother of three children aged 2, 5 and 7 simply had to drop everything when her servants quit on short notice. Samira had no choice but to quit her job after her leave time ran out. "I was in a difficult situation. My work colleagues were dragged into my problems. Fortunately, my husband earns enough to keep us going," she said with relief.

Hania, a white-collar worker for a Casablanca-based company, is finding it extraordinarily difficult keeping the same woman to look after her 10-month-old daughter. For six months, Hania hired three different women to look after her baby. "These uneducated women are perfectly aware of how much we need them," Hania said indignantly. "*They* start blackmailing us to get what they want. I decided to stop giving in to them and took my little girl to the crèche [day care centre], where she is safe," she said. The situation is even worse for servants, some of whom have even more serious complaints about how they are treated on the job.

Hayat, 28, has worked as a housekeeper for 12 years, and said that many employers do not treat their staff with respect or acknowledge their rights as human beings. Hayat claimed to suffer all kinds of humiliation and mistreatment at the hands of her employers. Despite these indignities, the divorced mother must continue to work so that she can provide for her 10-year old daughter. "I frequently move from one house to another," Hayat said resignedly.

Zineb Lassiri, 34, has worked in a number of homes in Rabat and Casablanca since she was 18 and acknowledges that each employer is different. Sometimes, how a maid is treated depends on the circumstances in the house. Her best housekeeping experience, she said, came when she was working for a young couple in Casablanca five years ago. "For four years I felt at ease, because Nawal treated me like a sister. Everything was turned upside down when my employer's brother moved into the house for a few months. He was constantly harassing <u>me</u>," she said. Unwilling to create problems in the home, Zineb instead chose to leave with no explanation, she explained with tears in her eyes.

The media has begun to cover more and more stories highlighting tensions between housewives and maids in Moroccan homes. Therefore, a draft law aims to regulate domestic work and it is in the final stages of preparation. This draft bill will regulate the salary level of domestic workers, the legal minimum age for housemaids, and other important employment issues, including days off and breaches of contract.

"It's my pen that I can't give up," said 17-yearold Ramez Aloui. Aloui added that young people in Tunisia smoke because they consider smoking to be a symbol of manhood, an ability



to shoulder responsibility, and as a means to attract the opposite sex. He then pointed to his classmate Yasmine Nafati, 17, sitting next to him, playing with a cigarette between her fingers and blowing smoke out of her lips. Nafati said that she smoked her first cigarette when she was 14-years-old. She justified it by saying cigarettes are available everywhere at prices affordable to everyone.

Adham Dhaoui, a 16-year old student, goes every day to the coffee shop that is located near his school on Marseille Street. He justified his addiction to smoking by saying that it gives him more self-confidence and feels enjoyable. Dhaoui began smoking when he was 13 years old after pressure from friends. He took up the habit as something to do or as a "change of the mood" but now it is a daily practice that he can't avoid.

Hammadi Mahjoubi, a parent, said the reason young people smoke is due to "the absence of a law banning the selling of such products to students". He considered that to be some sort of encouragement of smoking, especially in light of the continued sale of individual cigarettes for low prices. Hammadi also accused educational institutions of not providing better activities for students to occupy their free time.

However, teacher Bessma Chanmi disagreed, saying that parents are <u>the ones</u> who encourage their children to smoke in an indirect way by giving them money and not monitoring their behaviour. She said parents give their children absolute freedom to act at an early age without any guidance or observation. "Educational institutions have for years been implementing an awareness policy to sensitise students about the harms of smoking, noting that they have formed health clubs for students that aim to warn them of the serious diseases and the negative complications of cigarettes on man's health," Chanmi added.

Since smoking can cause many deadly diseases the government has prepared an integrated awareness programme, both in the media and at schools, in order to reduce the percentage of smokers and subsequent deaths. The ministry has also

created 211 clinics to help people quit smoking. The clinics are staffed by specialised doctors who care for smokers both physically and psychologically. The government has also stepped up legal measures by banning smoking in public spaces and punishing violators with fines.

Farid Mekkaoui, 36, was married two years ago to Sophie, a 27-year-old French woman. They became friends through an internet discussion forum and conducted

a virtual relationship for a year. Then they met in Agadir, where they decided to seal their union. "Today we live in Marrakech," said Mekkaoui, who works in a hotel. His wife's found a good job there. He never thought he'd end up marrying a European girl. But the internet makes the whole world accessible.

Bouchra met her husband Mjid, a Moroccan living in Italy, on the internet. After a year and a half of interaction, they decided to get married. Bouchra is now getting ready to join him in the country where he now lives. Bouchra, who asked that her name be withheld to protect her privacy, said relationships over the internet can now be trusted more than those forged face-to-face. "At least with the internet, you know how to work out whether a relationship is genuine or not," she said. For <u>her</u>, people have more time and opportunities to get to know each other at a deeper level, if they're sincere.

Several young people reported turning to the internet to overcome their shyness. **Ahmed Ghourbal**, 22, said that getting to know young women over the internet can be easier than doing the same thing in everyday life. Today's social networks offer huge opportunities for meeting people. That's where he's looking for his soul-mate. And he is convinced he'll find her soon, because he has made virtual friends with dozens of girls.

Ali Chaâbani, a sociologist, told Magharebia that marriages based on internet relationships are a *phenomenon* which has grown in recent years due to the development of new technologies in Morocco. He expressed concern that internet relationships may not be built on "healthy, solid" foundations. Most of the relationships established with a view to marriage target people overseas, because many young people hope to live abroad to improve their social standing and discover new cultures.

One further thing I want to say is that a lot of jobs for the young can be fun for the people who do them and also useful to the community. Youngsters who help in schools, hospitals and with the elderly often derive a great deal of pleasure and satisfaction as well as contributing something valuable to local society.

In conclusion, I would add that when I was a girl, my father said my teens were a time for books, hobbies and academic studies. Thinking back, I feel I would have learnt much more -about myself, other people and life in general- if <u>he</u> had allowed me to do a limited amount of real work. Certainly, when she is old enough, I shall encourage my own daughter to do so, rather than waste her time with soap operas, computer games and discotheques, like so many people today.

New hope for jobless Moroccans

More than 26% of unemployed people in Morocco are young graduates, according to the High Commission for Planning (HCP). Around 67% of those without work are between 15 and 29 years old. "The numbers are staggering," Moroccan General Business Confederation (CGEM) official Jamal Belahrach said in Casablanca on Monday (March 11th).

Unions and the government now have a duty to turn social dialogue into something meaningful to guarantee business competitiveness, improve pay for workers and promote job creation, agreed company head Najibi Youssef. The employers' organisation is determined in 2013 to help resolve the problem of youth unemployment, CGEM officials said.

In response to the troubling rise in unemployment, many Moroccan NGOs are also working to help jobless youth. <u>These organisations</u> are stepping up to assist young people by offering training, recruitment and support. Meriem Lotfi, 25, said that civil society groups had helped her seek new opportunities and broadened her horizons for the future. "They enabled me to learn about other people's career paths and has given me examples to follow, and has had a positive effect on my productivity and professional independence," she said.

Young Casablanca resident Safaa has also benefited from NGO assistance."I improved my professionalism," <u>she</u> told Magharebia."In addition to determination and stamina, NGOs offer young people another pathway to employment," said Mounir, a Marrakech teacher in his twenties.

Meriem Kadiri, who runs EFE-Maroc, said her institution was working to create a bridge between young people and companies by ensuring that people's qualifications meet market needs. On March 4th, EFE launched its new "Al Morad" project, which will assist some 15,000 young Moroccans. The training programme is devised by international experts and tailored to the local labour market. More than 100 experts in different fields (consultants, HR experts, HR managers, company directors and academics) are involved.

"Employment is now a national issue. So, it is our duty, as an NGO that specialises in helping young people, to give them the tools <u>they</u> need to find lasting employment", Kadiri said.

During the month of Ramadan, Muslims observe a strict fast and participate in virtuous activities such as charitable giving and peace-making. It is a time of intense spiritual renewal for those who observe it. At the end of Ramadan, Muslims throughout the world observe a joyous three-day celebration called *Eid al-Fitr* (the Festival of Fast-Breaking).

Eid al-Fitr falls on the first day of Shawwal, the month which follows Ramadan in the Islamic calendar. It is a time to give in charity to those in need, and celebrate with family and friends the completion of a month of blessings and joy.

Before the day of Eid, during the last few days of Ramadan, each Muslim family gives a determined amount as a donation to the poor. This donation is of actual food -- rice, barley, dates, rice, etc. -- to ensure that the needy can have a holiday meal and participate in the celebration. This donation is known as *sadaqah al-fitr* (charity of fast-breaking).

On the day of Eid, Muslims gather early in the morning in outdoor locations or mosques to perform the Eid prayer. This consists of a sermon followed by a short congregational prayer.

After the Eid prayer, Muslims usually scatter to visit various family and friends, give gifts especially to children who feel very glad. Families also make phone calls to distant relatives to give well-wishes for the holiday. These activities traditionally continue for three days. In most Muslim countries, the entire 3-day period is an official government/school holiday.
