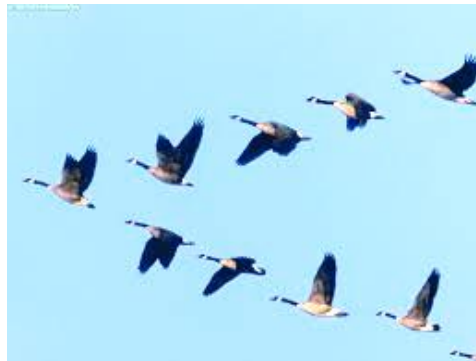

D. LET US WATCH THE 2ND VIDEO AND LEARN THE LESSONS OF TEAMWORK FROM THE ACTIONS OF THE GEESE.

Directions: Each fact about geese contains a lesson about working in groups. Read each fact and then note what its particular lesson might be. The first one has been completed for you.

Fact 1: As each goose flaps its wings, it creates an “uplift” for the birds that follow. By flying in a V formation, the whole flock adds 71 percent greater flying range than could be achieved if each bird flew alone.

Lesson: People who share a common direction and a sense of the group’s goals can eventually accomplish it more quickly and easily. Mutual support makes everyone more efficient.

Fact 2: When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of flying alone. It quickly moves back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front of it.

Lesson:

Fact 3: When the lead goose tires, it rotates back into formation and another goose flies to the front position.

Lesson:

Fact 4: The geese flying in formation honk to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

Lesson:

Fact 5: When a goose gets sick or wounded or is shot down, two geese drop out of the formation and follow it down to help and protect it. They stay with it until it dies or is able to fly again. Then they launch out with another formation or catch up with the flock.

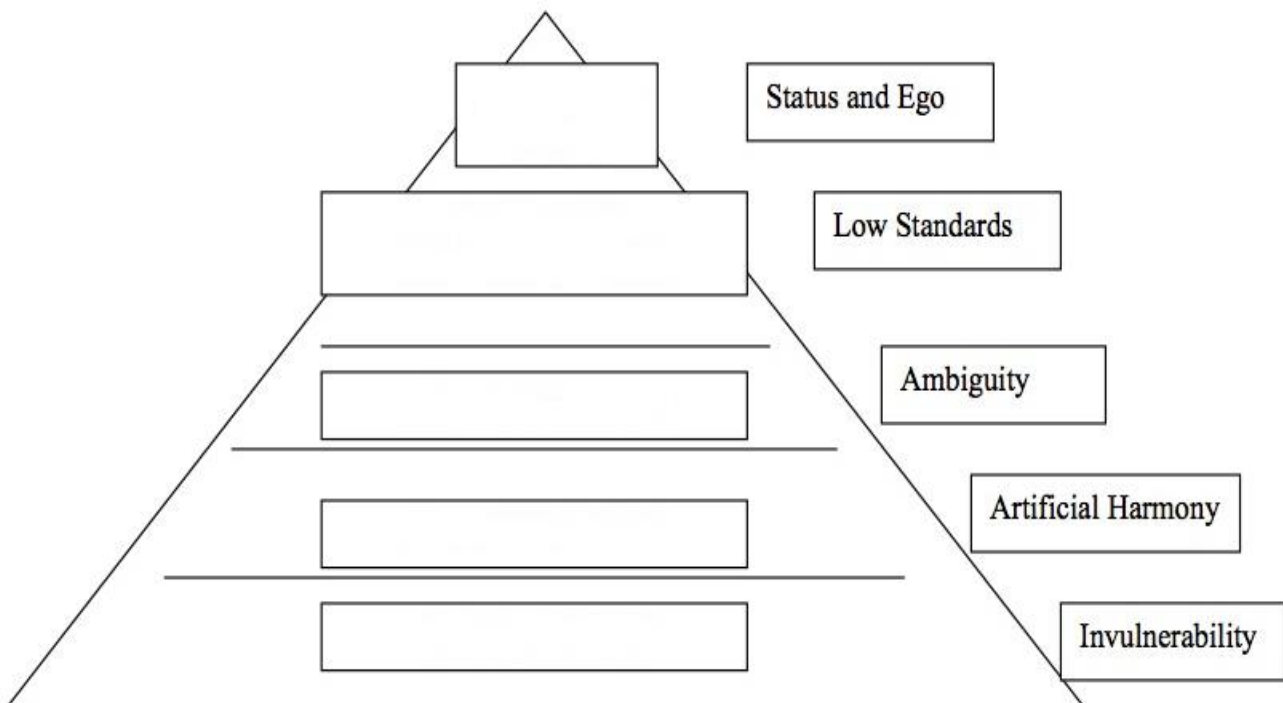
